MYRTLE BEACH, S.C. (AP) - An 1,100 hundred mile interstate highway connecting northern Michigan and South Carolina needs to move forward.

That's according to Transportation Secretary Mary Peters, who says for too long the project has been stalled by studies, findings and reviews.

Southern sections of the road have already been built. But finishing the project will be pricey.

The South Carolina leg alone will cost \$2 billion dollars. So far, South Carolina state legislators have set aside \$100 million dollars.

As proposed, the highway would weave through Ohio, West Virginia, Virginia and North Carolina.
